

# WUMC IN THE COMMUNITY UPDATE

The Wooster Homelessness Task Force had requested Wooster UMC's help again this winter with their Severe Weather Shelter meals. This program operates whenever temperatures reach a wind chill reading of 25 degrees or lower.

We were asked to cover any Thursdays the shelter would be open this winter. On these Thursdays, Wooster UMC would be on call for a meal to feed 25-30 people.

Many hands are necessary to honor this commitment volunteers were needed to prepare meals in advance. deliver meals to the shelter, serve meals, and organize volunteers.

We were able to gather 8 to prepare freezer meals, 2 to prepare a meal at home and deliver to the shelter, 5 to pick up meals at WUMC and deliver to the shelter, 7 to serve meals at the shelter, and 2 to coordinate it all!

Thanks to your generosity, a warm meal will be served on this winter's coldest days!


