
WUMC kids will share their Christmas pageant, "Follow That Star!" with the WUMC congregation during the December 22 10:00a service.

Pastor's Ponderings: "On Our Way to Bethlehem"

Where do you plan to travel this holiday season? Is someone traveling to come and see you? The time between Thanksgiving and New Year's, including Christmas, is one of the busiest travel seasons of the year. As a child, I used to look forward to an annual trip to the New York City area to spend a few days with my extended family. The anticipation of experiencing the hustle and bustle of city life and seeing family made me eager to take those trips again and again.

Where will your travels take you? We're so often focused on the destination in our travels. "Where are you going?" is the most common question upon hearing that someone is heading out of town. While the destination is perhaps the main reason for deciding to "go," it's often the journey itself that offers the most memorable moments – whether frustrating or delightful.

This Advent season, we will pay attention not just to the final destination of Christmas. We will also attune ourselves to the places where events occurred that led to a starry night on which a child was born who would change the world. Along the way, we will be invited to ponder our own milestones, including the progress and the potholes "on the way."

"On the Way to Bethlehem" is a worship series developed by Marcia McFee (Worship Design Studio) and inspired by the book "On the Way to Bethlehem: An Advent Study" by Rob Fuquay. Below is our weekly schedule of worship themes:

- Dec. 1 First Sunday of Advent "Rome: A Place of Longing (Hope)"
- Dec. 8 Second Sunday of Advent "Jerusalem: A Place of Waiting (Peace)"
- Dec. 15 Third Sunday of Advent "Nazareth: A Place of Simplicity (Joy)"
- Dec. 22 Fourth Sunday of Advent "Bethlehem: A Place of Humility (Love)"
- Dec. 24 Christmas Eve "The Manger: A Place of Care"
- Dec. 29 First Sunday After Christmas "Persia: A Place of Return"

PRAYER: Dear Lord, may I become more aware this season of the journey of my life. Help me to see and discover you as my Guide. As I make my way to Christmas, may I step aside from the daily destinations of life to consider where my journey is ultimately taking me and where you want to lead me. Help me to be open to sights and stops you want to show me as I go, so that when I arrive at Christmas, I will be at a new starting point of my journey. Amen.


