
GREETERS **NEEDED!**

Pastor's Ponderings: "The Creator's Valentine for You"

We've likely heard that God is Love. We often sing about the way that "Jesus Loves Me." But did you know that there's absolutely nothing that can keep us apart from the love of God?

In Romans 8, Paul poses the following questions: "Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?"

Paul goes on to answer his questions, stating:

"No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Through his own experience of suffering as he aimed to faithfully follow Jesus, Paul came to see God's love in a brand-new way. For Paul, love wasn't just some lofty ideal, some abstract concept that Jesus taught about. No, God's love was real! We see it most clearly displayed for us on the cross. God's love is a powerful force that will always be there, even if we can't feel it.

As I read Paul's statement of faith about the love of God, I hear it as a promise meant for every person. Yes, that means this truth applies to those who love God, as well as all kinds of people who've <u>not yet</u> chosen to love God. And it's especially meant for those who've specifically chosen <u>not</u> to love God. It doesn't matter where we stand. The good news is that we can <u>never</u> be separated from the love of God that comes to us in Jesus Christ.

One of the distinctive beliefs of the Christian faith is grace, including the kind of grace that comes to us before we have any concept of what it is. We don't need to go about earning God's love because it just is. In the same way that a baby has no ability to earn the love of his or her parents, so it is for us. God's love is already there for us is the message we get when we read. "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" and "We love because God first loved us."

What Paul says about God's love tells me that my identity is rooted firmly in WHO I am, not so much in WHAT I do. First and foremost, I am a beloved child of God. Everything else that follows is simply my response to God's love. And so friends, that's where loving God and serving others must always begin. I invite you to receive God's love. Soak it in. This is God's deep desire for you.
