

WUMC participated in The East Ohio Conference's Teach • Reach • Bless campaign, which raised more than \$1.5 million to build and furnish a residence hall for female students on the campus of Africa University in Zimbabwe.

After hearing Rev. Bill McFadden speak of the need for scholarships, WUMC has committed to supporting AU female students through "Lift Her Up", which raises money for scholarships (\$28,000 for each undergraduate degree) so that female students in refugee camps who have been accepted at AU will have the funds to enroll.

The initial payment has already been made and WUMC will be matched with a student before classes start in August. Pastor's Ponderings: Putting Down Roots

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. (Colossians 2:6-7, NRSV)

My family and I are grateful to be completing our first year with you here in Wooster. A year ago (2023), we were busily sorting through our stuff and packing our belongings in preparation for the move. We wondered if we had enough time between the end of school and the official move date to get "everything" done in time.

It ended up being a big year of moves for our family as, not only did we move our family's home-base from Orrville to Wooster, but our son Joshua moved off to Kentucky for his first year of college and Beth's mom relocated to a smaller home in the Columbus area.

I guess you could say that we're thankful that this summer of 2024 doesn't involve so much in the way of transitions, whew! Instead, we're glad to say that we're feeling settled in our home and are beginning to put down some roots in the church and Wooster community.

As your pastor, I realize that the same kind of process can happen in the lives of laypersons as you think about your own relationship to God through a church. At times in your life, you may feel strongly rooted in a congregation. Yet, things happen which cause you to feel uprooted:

A move. A pandemic. A change in work. Kids moving out. Kids being born. Denominational uncertainty. Unending conflict. All these things can contribute to a season of disconnection.

I want to express my desire to you that our congregation, Wooster UMC, can and will be a place where people can safely lay down roots. We call that process CONNECT - GROW - SERVE.

Please realize that not every person who will connect with our congregation has come here because they are new to town, although we certainly celebrate those who have found us that way! In these times of change, there are others who, at one point, had deeper roots in a congregation (whether it be ours or another church). They became disconnected for a season.

Perhaps you feel that you're in that place. Or you may know friends who are in that place. If so, I pray that you will receive these words of encouragement that are found above from Colossians 2:6-7, where we are encouraged to stay grounded and rooted in faith in Christ Jesus.

I believe that this congregation is a place where you can safely be planted and rooted in the Lord. In that spirit, some efforts are underway to connect with folks who felt uprooted in recent years. I believe we are in a new season of ministry now that allows for new roots to be established. Please help me extend that invitation and welcome back to anyone who needs it!
