The Central Valley (formerly Canal) district office is scheduling listening posts throughout the district and one of them will be held at WUMC!



Pastor's Ponderings: Hallelujah! The Tomb is Empty! Jesus is Alive!

I don't know about you, but I'm always amazed at the difference in the behavior of Jesus' disciples before and after the Resurrection. You've seen those "Before and After" pictures, haven't you? In the "Before" shot, the guy looks like he just got out of bed, his clothing is disheveled, and his gut is hanging out. In the "After" shot, he appears almost unrecognizably healthy. Everything looks great and he looks like he's ready to go out and conquer the world.

That's kind of how I imagine the disciples. Before Easter, they've all but lost hope. They hid themselves in a room out of fear. But three days later, all of a sudden, their lives have a clear purpose. They have the Hope of the Resurrection deeply embedded in their hearts and souls. They will not waste a single moment of the rest of their lives on things that don't really matter.

Did you realize that we, too, are part of the Resurrection story? Because Jesus has conquered death, we have a new life and a holy purpose. So, what's our purpose? The mission of Jesus' followers is the same no matter where you go: it's to make disciples. Period.

In the United Methodist Church, we use the language, "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" to describe it. And fueling that mission is our sure and certain hope in the Resurrection of Christ. Even in the midst of changing and uncertain times, we can count on the fact that our mission will never change. Even if we find ourselves disagreeing about the finer points of how to live out our faith, the mission of Jesus never changes.

I'm glad to share several opportunities that we have during Holy Week to remember what Jesus has done for us as he finished out his own mission on the cross.

On Palm Sunday (March 24), we will gather for morning worship at 10:00 a.m., journeying with Jesus into Jerusalem in his Triumphal Entry. That afternoon, our church will host the community Lenten service at 4:00 p.m. with special guest preacher, Rev. Edgar Brady, who is one of our new co-district superintendents.

On Maundy Thursday (March 28), we will hold a special time of worship at 7:00 p.m. in our sanctuary. Our service will include prayer, music, holy communion, and a meaningful drama which will help us find our way into the story.

On Good Friday (March 29), Oak Chapel UMC will host the annual choir cantata at 7:00 p.m. Several of our singers will take part in this worshipful presentation of the Passion of Christ.

On Easter Sunday (March 31), we will gather for worship at 10:00 a.m. to joyously celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus. Events before and after the worship service will add to the joy of the day.


