Suggested donations include pasta, canned sauce, mac & cheese, canned vegetables and fruit, healthy cereals, and canned meats. Our Sunday School children are also getting involved—their February collection will contribute to this cause! A donation station will be set up at the What's Up Table in Wesley Hall. Pastor's Ponderings:

"A Lenten Invitation"

Wednesday, March 5 marks the beginning of this year's Lenten season. I invite you to attend our Ash Wednesday worship service held in the sanctuary that evening at 7:00p. Ashes will be imposed in the sign of the cross upon people's foreheads as a symbol of repentance.

What is Lent and why do we observe it? The Lenten season is a 40-day period of preparation (not including Sundays) between Ash Wednesday and Easter. This year, Easter Sunday is April 20, which is one of the latest dates on which Easter can fall. Lent is observed as a solemn and reflective time of the Christian year in which people make an intentional effort to grow in their relationship with God. Traditionally, people practice spiritual disciplines such as prayer, fasting, repentance, and self-denial. We do these things in order to position ourselves so that God can be at work in our lives, offering us the grace that produces good fruit in us (Galatians 5:22-23).

Earlier this year, we identified a set of key Shared Values which help our congregation answer the question, "WHO are we?" Those values are: Serving Others, Spiritual Growth, Inclusion and Diversity, Cherishing Children/Youth/Families, and Stewardship of God's Resources. See the graphic at right for more detail about what those values mean.

During this year's Lenten season, we will continue to make progress in our Visioning Process for our congregation by asking the "WHY" question. Specifically, the question is: "Why Do We Exist?" Another way to ask it is: "What is our PURPOSE?"

A Scripture passage about the purpose of Christ's Church will be featured each week during Lent, inspiring us to reflect on why we (the church) exist. In order to reflect on these passages well, we're inviting you to be creative with your responses. Over the course of the Lenten season, collectively, we will create an art gallery in our hallways with various expressions of artwork such as pictures, paintings, poetry, and other handmade items, which will be hung on wall space.

A hub of activity during Lent will be our Chapel, a space near Wesley Hall, where you can find materials and designated space to be creative anytime you are at the church. Please take time to visit the Chapel to find more instructions about how to participate in this all-church activity. I look forward to sharing this Lenten season with you as we commit to this period of intentional spiritual growth for our entire congregation.
