## Pastor's Newsletter

## "Program-Sized: A Church with Options"

When I first started at Wooster UMC two years ago, I emphasized my hope that we would live into a vision of being of what's called a Program-Sized Church. What do I mean by Program-Sized? Think of it as a congregation that can offer a variety of choices for how people can be involved in activities like worship, discipleship, and serving others. Program-Sized churches employ multiple staff leaders who don't try and do it all themselves; rather, they give direction to those efforts and help laypeople lead and get involved. A strength of a congregation like ours is that we still have enough human, financial, and facility resources to provide a variety of options people can choose to participate in.

One example of that is in the area of Missions. We've invited the congregation to consider participating in a variety of mission-related efforts. Some are happening here in our local area, while others take place farther away, around the globe. Some efforts invite us to contribute money, some invite us to make and/or donate tangible items, others invite us to roll up our sleeves to do hard work, and still others invite us to simply show up and be present with others who need to know that someone cares. I hope you're hearing the variety and ability to choose amongst these options.

Once in a while, we may ask the entire congregation to participate in an "All-Church" type of campaign, such as our yearlong "The Story" discipleship focus which has provided the themes for our worship services and several small groups. Another all-church example is when funds were raised to build new dorms and raise scholarships for women attending Africa University. Yet, by and large, it's unrealistic to think that EVERY-one will get involved with EVERY-thing.

I think there's a different question we should consider—actually two questions. First, can you imagine what it would look like if EVERY person in the congregation was involved in a group that helped grow their faith? And second, what would it look like if EVERY person in the congregation found at least one way to serve others using their gifts? That would be amazing, right?! It might remind us of the beautiful passages we read in the book of Acts that describe the early church, empowered by the Holy Spirit (See Acts 2:42-27 and 4:32-35).

While we certainly have more people involved in congregational life than many churches around us, by no means would I consider Wooster UMC to be a "large" congregation. I realize that our congregation was of an even greater size at one time, with multiple appointed pastors. However, I don't think many of us believe that we would function well as a "small" family-sized church either, where the expectation is that everyone knows everyone else and that everyone is expected to participate in everything that goes that goes on. And so, what's important is that you discover smaller groups within the church where you can connect, grow, and serve.

I celebrate being part of a church with options! As we move from the season of Easter toward Pentecost, I wish you joy and hope as we live empowered by the Holy Spirit! Thanks be to God!


